

DIDACTIC REGULATIONS
Department of Medical Law Department of Forensic Medicine
Wrocław Medical University
for students of all faculties
for the winter semester of academic year 2021/2022

1. The obligatory subject **Medical law** for 5th year students of English Division according to the course syllabus and the study plan approved by the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, English Division includes:
 - lectures – 10h,
 - seminars – 20 h.
2. The additional compulsory subject **LDEK preparing Block – Jurisdiction** for the 5th year students of English Division according to the course syllabus and the study plan approved by the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry, English Division includes:
 - seminars – 5 h.
3. The course syllabus, which is available in the Department's information board and on the Department's website under the Didactics tab, contains the aims and educational results of the course as well as the subject matter of the classes and the list of literature.
4. Persons who are on the list of students approved by the appropriate Dean's Office of the Wrocław Medical University should participate in obligatory classes.
5. According to the study regulations of Wrocław Medical University - students' attendance at seminars and lectures is obligatory.
6. Classes in which a student has been absent should be excused and made up by arrangement with the person who is teaching the subject. All absences must be made up, including Rector's days and Dean's hours.
7. The students can make up the missed seminars on other dates than the scheduled ones after making an appointment with teaching assistant, dr. Radosław Drozd (room nr 37 KiZMS – 3rd floor), tel. 071 784 17 35, e-mail: radoslaw.drozd@umw.edu.pl
8. Once a student has made up a class, he or she must immediately present the appropriate certificate to the Department's Office.
9. The change of the training group is possible, with the consent of the Head of the Department of Forensic Medicine, after submitting an application in the secretary's office (e-mail form is also acceptable). In addition to a justification, the application must include the student's full name, group and index number and the group the student would like to join.

10. The credit of the seminars is conditional on attendance at classes in accordance with the study regulations, active participation in them and passing the test in a written form. The test will take place during the last class of each seminar group. The test will consist of 10 single-choice questions (5 possible answers, correct answer = 1 point, incorrect answer = 0 point) covering the topics of the seminars. A total maximum of 10 points can be earned. Pass mark: 6 points. Duration of test: 15 minutes.

Grading scale of the test for credit of seminars:

11. The student must obtain a positive grade from the exam in the winter semester of the academic year in order to pass the course in Medical Law.

12. To take an exam, students must receive a passing grade in the seminars.

13. The basic form of assessment of the course is a test consisting of closed, single-choice questions (15 questions, 5 possible answers, correct answer = 1 point, incorrect answer = 0 point) and open questions (3 questions, scored depending on the degree of correctness of the answer given for a maximum of 2, 3 and 4 points). A total maximum of 24 points can be earned. Pass mark = 14 points. Students will have 40 minutes to complete the test.

14. The results of the test examinations are published in the Department's information board and sent by email to the supervisor and the senior of the year no later than the next working day.

15. Test examinations are kept in the teaching secretary's office of the Department for a period of 24 months. Students have the right to inspect them for a period of 2 weeks after the results are announced. Viewing the work at a later date is possible by arrangement with the examiner or the person teaching the subject.
16. It is possible to take an **oral exam** before the examination session - the condition is a distinctive pass in seminars and confirmed attendance at lectures.
17. The oral exam before the examination session date consists of three questions drawn by the student (one question each from the three groups of topics):
- I. Patient's rights. Medical records.
 - II. Informed consent.
 - III. Other topics covered during seminars and lectures.
- Examination topics are posted in the Department's information board and available on the Department's website under the Didactics tab.
18. Receiving a failing grade in a preterm will deprive the student of the first exam date.
19. Credit/examination results will be entered by the person responsible for the course in the electronic records available in the Virtual University information system.
